

aurus Wilson has been with the Boys & Girls Club since he was a little boy. He is now a grown 18 year old, ready to take on college. Taurus' mother, Towanna, was raised as a Club child at the "old" club in East Gadsden. She always knew she wanted her children to grow up with the same benefits of the Boys & Girls Club that she did.

Taurus is the epitome of what the Club can achieve when it's at its best. He was a state finalist for the Youth of the Year Award this year, and he is slated to be very competitive again in 2020. He plays for the "Magic" boys basketball team and can often be found sweeping, helping the younger students get settled for dinner, or cracking a joke with one of the Senior Aide employees. While his servant's heart has blossomed under the roof of the Club, his will to achieve has become even more resolute. Throughout the past semester, Taurus has worked tirelessly in the Club's ACT prep program to raise his score. That hard work has paid off with his score jumping three points in early December. We are blessed to call the Wilson family one of our own and Taurus is the fruit of that cherished relationship.



avid Bright was referred to Darden because he was experiencing substance abuse issues, walked with a cane, was a heavy smoker, overweight and needed assistance finding competitive employment. He started working in Darden's Work Adjustment Program. During this time, he quit smoking, dropped about 40 pounds, and no longer needs a cane to walk. He had a very pleasing disposition and great work ethic, striving for perfection at whatever job he was given. He has been in prison and lost all of his IDs. His job developer, Dana

Johnson, helped him obtain his driver's license, birth certificate, and social security card. She also assisted David with setting up a bank account and was able to place him to work at Anthony's Automotive doing auto detail work. He had done this type of work before. His VR Counselor helped pay for work shoes and clothes. After working for a month, David received a raise. Dana said that she doesn't think she has ever worked with an individual who was so excited about going to work. He is proud to have a job and continues to do a good job every day.



We fight for the mental, physical, and emotional health of our citizens.

he Etowah Free Community Clinic provides medical care for uninsured patients in Etowah County.

They also provide non-narcotic prescription medications free of charge through the Prescription Resource Network, diabetic education, cardiovascular care and financial assistance for diagnostic testing. All services are completed by volunteer physicians, nurses and medical students.

The team at the Free Clinic has been serving a 51 year old male for 2 1/2 years. He was a drug addict with elevated blood pressure, GERD, and Neuropathy. With help from medications prescribed, he now has all three conditions under control and with counseling from our psychological counselor, he is now drug free. He now has a full time job and will be getting his own insurance soon.



We fight for **individuals** during crisis and respond to **basic needs**.

tatistically, 1 in every 10 children will be sexually assaulted before the age of 18. The Barrie Center has specialized training in conducting the forensic interviews and trauma focused therapy. The overall mission is to provide a child friendly environment to allow children to share their trauma history in a way that mitigates the overall experience of having to tell their experiences to multiple people involved. The Barrie Center works collaboratively with the District Attorney's office, DHR, law enforcement, our local judicial officials, medical providers, school system and other non-profit agencies to collaboratively provide for the investigation and intervention in child abuse cases.

They have recently added a four legged member to the staff. Kuzco is a Canine Companions for Independence Facility Dog who is trained to comfort

abuse victims during forensic interviews, therapy and court proceedings. The center received Kuzco in November and he works each day with children and families at the center.

The Barrie Center also provides trauma focused therapy to child victims, the non offending caretaker and families as well as community education related to child abuse intervention and mandatory reporting requirements.

During 2019, The Barrie Center staff provided forensic interviews for three teenagers. A trauma therapist began to see all three individually as well as the non-offending caregiver. Staff had the opportunity to be with them in the judicial proceedings to provide support as the offender was sentenced. They gave impact statements to the judge and were commended for their bravery for coming forward and disclosing such horrendous abuse


